Dear Professor Bassiouni,


Thank you for the material kindly made available through Professor Opsahl.

As you probably know, Professor Opsahl is going on a mission to Zagreb, 11-14 August 1993, to meet with and interview five imprisoned alleged war criminals, former members of Serb irregular forces, before they are considered for an exchange of prisoners. The five prisoners are: Dusan Gjuranov, Zeljko Naglic, Ivanka Savic, Ivica Vulteric and Nenad Bojic. We would greatly appreciate information on possible existing references in the database to these individuals before the mission starts.

I will leave Geneva 11 August 1993 at 9 a.m., and the information can be transmitted by telefax to the Secretariat of the Commission of Experts. The time constraints under which our request is made are unfortunate, but the names of the prisoners were only recently made available to us.
