BACKGROUND

This matter came before the Oil & Gas Board of Review ["Board"] upon appeal by Robert L. Ratchford, deceased, and Sara S. Ratchford from Chief's Order 94-83. Chief's Order 94-83 required the plugging of two permitted gas wells.

On April 27, 1995, this cause came on for hearing at the Ohio Department of Natural Resources Complex, Columbus, Ohio. Following the presentation of evidence, the Board deliberated upon this matter, and announced the following findings, conclusions and order:

The Board FINDS that Chief's Order 94-83 is unlawful and unreasonable as to Sara S. Ratchford, because there is no evidence on the Record that she was the owner when the wells drilled pursuant to permits 18 and 23 became incapable of producing gas.

The Board also FINDS that Robert L. Ratchford was the permit holder for permits 18 and 23. And, there is sufficient evidence presented to find that there is no transfer of record pursuant to Ohio Revised Code §1509.31. And, there is sufficient evidence that Robert died in 1985, and that his estate may have been the successor-in-interest to the permits.

And the Board, on the basis of the evidence presented, AGREES with the findings in the Chief's Order that The New Albany Company is the current owner of the property. And, there is sufficient evidence to find that the wells drilled pursuant to permits 18 and 23 are incapable of producing gas.

The Board further FINDS that the Chief's Order is reasonable and lawful as to Robert L. Ratchford, deceased, and his successors, assigns and agents.
