INTRODUCTION

RESTRUCTURING UNDER NAFTA

We are concerned here tonight about restructuring under NAFTA: what are the considerations, and how do we implement them? Has NAFTA changed patterns of manufacturing location and distribution and of market penetration?

Our first speaker is Bill Kelly, who is the Director of International Governmental Affairs for Ford Motor Company. Bill has been with the State Department. He is a member of various trade organizations. He handles many of the problems that Ford runs into in its worldwide focus. He was a member of a key advisory group on NAFTA. He has a B.A. from St. Joseph's College in Philadelphia and an M.A. from the University of Arizona, and he has also studied at George Washington University.

David Winfield, our second speaker, is Senior Vice President of Government Relations at Northern Telecom (Nortel). He is a member of Nortel's senior management committee. He is a former Canadian ambassador to Mexico and he has had a long service in the Diplomatic Corps. He sits on the Board of Directors of Grupo Financiero Bancomer, one of Mexico's largest financial institutions.
