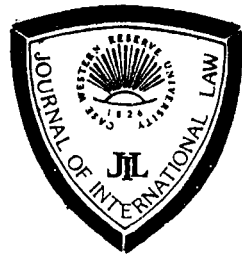

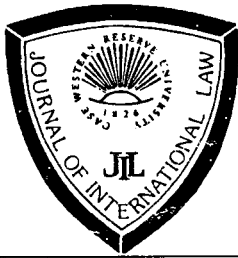

Now entering its eleventh year of publication, the *Case Western Reserve Journal of International Law* proudly releases for general circulation this Winter 1979 issue. The issue deals with contemporary issues facing the international legal community. Topics covered include direct elections to the European Parliament, the historical background of Common Article 3 of the 1949 Geneva Convention, wars of national liberation, freedom of movement, and antitrust implications for East-West trade.
