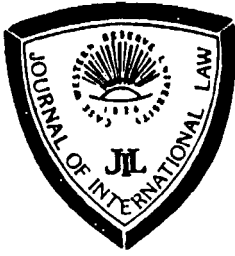
EDITOR'S NOTE
