Foreword

The editors of the WESTERN RESERVE LAW REVIEW offer in this issue the third annual survey of significant developments in the law of Ohio reported during 1954.

Following the pattern heretofore set, this survey has been written by members of the faculty of Western Reserve Law School. The cases surveyed are those which appeared in Northeastern Reporter, Second Series, between January 1 and December 31, 1954. As before, we promise that those decided in 1954 but not reported in that source until 1955 will be considered, if deemed important, in next year's survey.

Again we were faced with the most difficult problem of choosing a limited number of cases out of many which appear in print. We can only use our best judgment and hope it coincides substantially with that of our readers. Accordingly we have found no cases involving the law of Contracts, Damages, Sales, Trade Regulations, or Trusts which were considered important enough to include.
