

LISLE M. BUCKINGHAM - BIOGRAPHY

Lisle M. Buckingham, graduated magna cum laude from Western Reserve University in 1917, and at that time was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. Subsequently, he graduated with honors from the Law School of Western Reserve University, and because of that was elected to the Order of the Coif.

In 1967, Case Western Reserve University presented him with the Fletcher Reed Andrews Award - "Outstanding Law Alumni Award Western Reserve University".

In 1969, the Ohio State Bar Association awarded the Ohio Bar medal, the highest award made by the Association to a member of the legal profession, and in 1970, the University of Akron conferred the Honorary Degree of Doctor of Laws.

He received the Polsky Award in 1978. He received the Sir Thomas More Award in 1981. The University of Akron named its "Continuing Education Center" - "The Lisle M. Buckingham Center" in 1981.

He commenced the practice of law in Akron on the sixth day of October, 1919, and since that time has served as Trustee of the following institutions:
